- I understand that my admission to the University of Connecticut requires that I attend and complete the Student Support Services' (SSS) Pre-collegiate Summer Program, June 24, 2012 to August 2, 2012. I realize that if I do not comply with the above, I will not be admitted to the University.
- I will spend six weeks in residence at the campus of acceptance during the summer of 2012 as a student in the SSS Pre-collegiate Program.
- I will abide by all rules pertaining to proper classroom etiquette and abide by the University's Student Code of Conduct.
- I will attend all classes and complete all assignments on time.
- I will meet with the SSS professional staff on a weekly basis during the summer and the academic year.
- I will seek tutorial help when recommended or as needed, and will meet with my assigned tutor as directed.
- I will register for no more than four core courses for each semester of my freshman year not to exceed the limit of fourteen (14) credits.
- I understand that I will earn up to seven (7) academic credits.
- I understand that if I receive lower than a "C" for any course offered during the summer component, I will not earn credit for that course. I will take a comparable course during the following semester as part of the University requirement.
- I understand that the SSS staff may discuss my status at the University with my parent/guardian during the summer Pre-Collegiate Program. I also understand that if my parent/guardian inquires about my progress during my academic tenure at UConn, the SSS staff will be at liberty to discuss my status.
- I understand I will need to enroll in a SSS First Year Experience (FYE) course during the fall semester.
- Failure to adhere by SSS regulations and University Student Conduct Code will be means for dismissal from the University.
- I will abide by all SSS rules and regulations.

**STUDENT COPY**

Students responsible for violating the following rules and regulations will be subject to disciplinary action and/or dismissal from the Program and the University.

1. Possession and/or use of drugs of any kind is illegal.
2. No handguns or weapons are allowed on University property.
3. No alcoholic beverages are allowed in the Residence Halls.
3. Program and Class attendance is compulsory. There are no excused class absences except in the case of illness, which is confirmed through SSS professional staff, hall director and/or the infirmary.
5. All assigned homework must be completed on time.
6. Residence Halls should always be conducive to study and rest.
7. Study hours will be monitored from 7:00 - 10:00 P.M.
8. Students must remain on campus at all times. Permission to leave must be granted in advance by SSS professional staff.
9. Students are not allowed to keep vehicles on campus or ride in vehicles other than when en route to and from home, or when special permission is granted by a member of the SSS professional staff with parental consent.
10. SSS students are not allowed to have overnight guests at anytime in the Residence Hall during the six-week phase of the Pre-collegiate Program.
11. Off-Campus guests and visitors can only visit SSS students on the weekends (i.e. Friday evenings, all day Saturday, and Sunday until 7:00 P.M.) Parents or Guardians are allowed to visit during the week.
